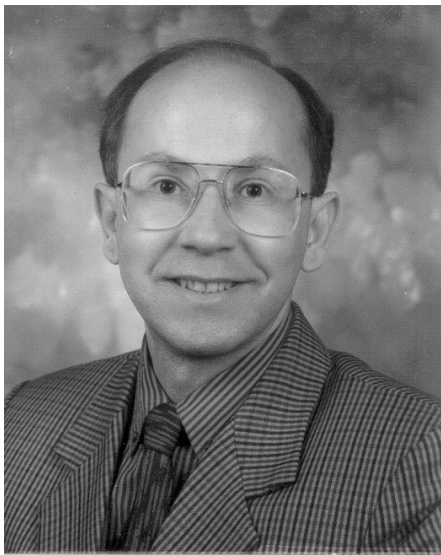

OSU Forestry Department Welcomes Wood Products Specialist

Dr. Salim Hiziroglu has joined the faculty of the Forestry Department at Oklahoma State University as an assistant professor and wood products extension specialist. Salim joins the department after serving as assistant professor for the Department of Forestry at Michigan State University. He brings an in depth knowledge of wood composites and years of international experience with him. Salim received his B.S. in forest products engineering from the Blacksea Technical University in Turkey. He then earned a M.S. in wood sciences and technology from the University of California at Berkley before moving to Michigan State University where he earned a Ph.D. in forest products in 1989.

Salim's responsibilities at OSU will include courses in timber harvesting, logging and milling operations, wood properties, mechanical processes of wood, and an introduction to wood properties and products. In addition he will have an extension appointment and will serve as the wood products specialist for the department. He has already met with many of the wood industry organizations in the state and will continue to provide technical assistance to manufacturers and producers. Camp Offers Oklahoma Youth Opportunity to Explore Natural Resources

This June youth from cities, suburbs, and farms across the state converged on Beaver's Bend State Park near Broken Bow, Oklahoma to attend Oklahoma's award winning Youth Forestry and Wildlife Camp. The camp provided 62 youths and 12 adult volunteer leaders with an opportunity to learn about the natural environment and to explore careers in forestry, wildlife, and related natural resource fields.

While enjoying the outdoors, campers explored natural resource management and the issues affecting our natural resources through a series of hands on outdoor education programs. Many organizations assisted in the development and presentation of these programs including Oklahoma Department of Agriculture - Forestry Services, Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, Pan Pacific Products, OSU Cooperative Extension, Georgia Pacific, Tommy Phillips Contracting, Oklahoma Forestry Association, and USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service. These programs included wildlife management, forest management, stream quality, fire management, urban forestry, multiple resource management, and forest utilization. After a day of exploring some of Oklahoma's most beautiful forests and streams, campers participated in a variety of evening programs such as outdoor challenge games, reptile and animal shows, and campfire programs. Of course there was also plenty of time for activities such as swimming, boating, sporting clays, hiking, fishing, volleyball, basketball, woodworking, and making new friends from all over the state.

The annual camp is made possible by the support of Oklahoma's forest industry and concerned individuals. Fifth Annual Forest Utilization Conference Held at Western Hills Resort

The 2000 Timber Utilization Conference and Equipment Exposition was held this April 26-28, 2000 at Western Hills Resort near Wagoner, Oklahoma. During its fifth year, the conference again offered concurrent sessions for landowners, primary producers, secondary manufactures, and anyone else with an interest in Oklahoma's forests and forest industry. Conference attendees also had a chance to preview the latest technologies available to the wood industry as factory representatives demonstrated their wares during the three day equipment exposition.

The conference featured numerous presentations on a variety of topics of interest to forest landowners. Dr. Bill Hoover, nationally known expert on forest taxation, from Purdue University gave a detailed presentation on *Forest Taxation Issues and the Federal Tax Code* that was well attended. Other topics included *Cost Share Programs, Special Forest Products, Hardwood Management and Natural Regeneration Systems, Timber Sales, Using Prescribed Burning in Forest and Wildlife Management, and The Effects of Forest Management on Wildlife*.

Right to Practice Forestry Legislation Could Become Reality

House Bill 2306 introduced by Representative Reese contains language that would define forestry activities as agricultural practices. The bill goes on to assure that those activities conducted consistent with good agricultural practices and established prior to nearby nonagricultural activities are presumed to be reasonable and do not constitute a nuisance unless the activity has a substantial adverse affect on the public health and safety. The bill made it through the House, but was changed in the Senate and has gone back to the House.

Research Challenges Traditional Views of Edge and Bobwhite Quail

Research conducted by Dr. Fred Guthery, Bollenbach Chairman at OSU, and a team of graduate students indicate that bobwhite populations in central and western Oklahoma apparently do not follow the same principle of edge that Aldo Leopold made popular. The research team determined population abundance on seventy-eight 500-acre sites in central and western Oklahoma during the summers of 1998 and 1999. Cover types included native prairie, pastures with introduced grasses (including CRP fields), mature oak timber, young oak timber, mixed prairie and brush, agricultural crops, river and stream bank areas, and other minor habitats. The data on population abundance was used to determine how cover types could be best arranged and to determine which types were most important to bobwhite populations.

The best two habitat types for bobwhites were found to be young oak timber and mixed prairie/brush. Each of these habitat types had native grasses with well interspersed, low woody cover. Areas in western Oklahoma with ample amounts of shinnery oak had the highest bobwhite populations.

When the team examined whether the amount of woody edge within a site affected abundance, it was found that bobwhites declined as woody edge increased. The rate of decline was low and we do not know whether our perception of edge matched that of bobwhites. However, the results show that the principle of edge cannot be applied blindly if one expects to increase bobwhite abundance. The results indicated farm and ranch managers can expect to add 1 to 3 calling males to a property for every 100 acres of young cross timbers or mixed brush and prairie that they add. This action would be expected to add about 1-3 females and 8-24 juveniles at the start of hunting season.

Collaborators on this project were Ron Masters, Department of Forestry, Oklahoma State University, and Steve DeMaso, Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation. DeMaso is now with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in Austin, TX.

Bollenbauch Quail Symposium to be Held Near Kingfisher

On August 4, 2000 farmers, ranchers, hunters, resource managers, and conservationists from across the area will meet at the Chisolm Trail Vo-Tech between Kingfisher and Watonga, OK. They are coming to share information on the ecology, management, and habits of the bobwhite quail, Oklahoma's premier upland game bird. The symposium will include nationally known quail experts such as Dale Rollins (Texas Agricultural Extension Service), Fred Guthery (Oklahoma State University), Roger Wells (Quail Unlimited), and many others. Presenters will cover topics such as habitat evaluation and improvement, lease hunting options, interactive land management effects, effect of predators, Effects of quail feeding, and more. There is a nominal registration fee of \$20 which includes refreshments, lunch, and informational handouts.

Numerous sessions on primary and secondary processing were also available to those involved in primary and secondary processing of wood products. Dr. Fred Lamb from Virginia Tech presented in depth information on dry kiln operation, maintenance, and scheduling as well as insect control. Other topics of interest included *Log Grading, Cutting for Grade, Marketing for Success, Hardwood Recovery, Exporting Wood Products, Pallet Recycling, Residue Utilization*, and panel discussions on value added opportunities for Oklahoma producers.

In addition conference participants were treated to some great food and opportunities to meet with others in Oklahoma's forest industry and discuss topics of mutual concern during the nightly socials and daily meals. The conference, which has grown dramatically since its origins five years ago, is administered by the Ouachita Mountains RC&D and supported by generous support from the Weyerhaeuser Company, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture - Forestry Services, Oklahoma Forestry Association, Wood Industry Association of Oklahoma, and the Oklahoma Woodland Owner's Association.
